## School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter Kenwood Elementary

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2018-19 educational progress for Kenwood Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2018-19 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Kenwood HAS NOT BEEN GIVEN ONE OF THESE LABELS.

We have noticed an increase in the number of "at-risk" students. These students may be struggling to become proficient in math and/or reading, they may have attendance issues, and they may be economically disadvantaged. In order to provide support for these students we have early intervention programs for our students in literacy. Using our MTSS and i-Ready screening process we identify students who may be falling behind and provide interventions that best fit the students. Interventions include: small group instruction, Leveled Literacy Intervention (LLI), and Sound Partners. These interventions are an additional reading class, student progress is monitored closely, and reports are shared with parents.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

- 1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL Students are assigned to Kenwood Elementary by residential area and/or by choice. Schools of Choice applicants may choose a school to attend at the time of enrollment. This choice is honored if there is a seat available.

  Kenwood continues to attend to the goals of our School Improvement Plan which is aligned to
  the district Strategic Plan. The Strategic Plan identified two areas of effort: Academic Excellence
  and Wellbeing. The Kenwood School Improvement Plan addresses these 2 areas and we have

identified two other areas on which to focus our efforts: Critical Thinking/ Problem Solving and Community Involvement and Pride. We believe these goals will improve our student achievement in all areas.



The units are implemented as indicated by curricular calendars. We do not vary from the State Standards.


