Here at Paul A. Schalm Elementary School we use a rigorous math program that correlates with the common core state standards. Teachers participate in data meetings to determine instructional grouping and tiered supports. Professional development continues to be designed to strengthen teacher's instructional skills and best practices. Through our MTSS process struggling students are identified and supported in multiple literacy interventions designed to build their literacy skills.

- PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL
   Students are assigned to Clawson school buildings based on residency within the district or through the school-of-choice application process.

School improvement plans are submitted as required by regulation and are implemented, reviewed, and revised as needed. We recently modified our district Strategic Plan and identified four areas of effort: Excellence, Wellbeing Critical Thinking and Problem Solving and Parent Involvement and Clawson Pride. The Schalm School Improvement Plan now addresses these four areas.

We use the Eureka Math Program to implement our math curriculum and our science and social studies units are provided by the local ISD. 5. THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR ANY LOCAL COMPETENCY TESTS OR NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS All test results for our school are listed within the pages of the following annual education report. Clawson Public Schools uses i-Ready for local assessments. We assess student 3 times per year in Reading and Math. This assessment data informs our school decisions about placement in intervention classes and small group instruction.

In the 2018-2019 school year our students made significant growth in both reading and math school wide.

In the fall 17% of our student population needed intensive support in reading and in the spring only 2% needed intensive support.

In the fall 20% of our student population needed intensive support in math and by spring only 3% needed that amount of support.

6. IDENTIFY THE PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

We had 97% of our parents who were able to attend parent-teacher conferences in the building. All other parents were contacted by the teacher for phone conferences or met at another time to discuss their child's progress towards the standards.
